Marjorie Weinman Sharmat (b. November 12, 1928 -) was born in Portland, ME and dreamed of becoming a writer. Little did she know that she would be the author of more than 130 books for children of all ages. Another of her childhood dreams, that of becoming a detective, has also been realized in her most popular Nate the Great series, begun in 1972. Many of Sharmat's books have been Literary Guild selections and chosen as Books of the Year by the Library of Congress. Several have been made into films for television, including Nate the Great Goes Undercover, winner of the Los Angeles International Children's Film Festival
